December 11th, 2017 - Primary biliary cirrhosis PBC is a chronic long duration disease characterized by progressive inflammation and destruction of the small bile ducts within the liver What are the bile ducts and what do they do Bile ducts are small tubes that transport bile from the liver to the larger hepatic ducts and into the gallbladder where bile is stored until a person eats

December 7th, 2018 - The gold standard for diagnosis of cirrhosis is a liver biopsy through a percutaneous transjugular laparoscopic or fine needle approach A biopsy is not necessary if the clinical laboratory and radiologic data suggests cirrhosis Furthermore there is a small but significant risk of complications from liver biopsy and cirrhosis itself predisposes for complications caused by liver biopsy

September 4th, 2018 - Cirrhosis represents a late stage of progressive hepatic fibrosis characterized by distortion of the hepatic architecture

and the formation of regenerative nodules It is generally considered to be irreversible in its advanced stages at which point the only treatment option may be liver
